NORTHMINSTER PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH 2025 SCHOLARSHIP Rules and Policies

The Northminster Presbyterian Church (NPC) Scholarship has been established by the members of

the Northminster Presbyterian Church of Ames, Iowa, to assist and encourage worthy and deserving persons to further their education. It is our goal to do this within the context of the Christian faith, with a vision for academic freedom, and with the historic concern for education, which has been so characteristic of our reformed heritage.

The scholarship may be awarded to a high school graduating senior enrolled in a public high school and/or to a student enrolled in a college of higher learning. A college of higher learning may include a four-year college or graduate school, a two-year community college, or a trade school. The school may be located anywhere in the United States. A student already enrolled in a college of higher learning may be in any academic classification from freshmen through graduate school.

Since this scholarship is established, presented, and administered by Northminster Presbyterian Church, applicants who are members or have an association with this congregation will receive preferential consideration.

The recipient must meet all academic requirements designated by his/her vocational or occupational area and meet the minimum requirements of the institution in which he/she is enrolling or is presently attending.

Mindful of the church's constant call to mission, the applicant's financial need (s) shall be considered when selecting. The NPC Scholarship Committee will decide the scholarship amount depending on the available funds. If there is more than one worthy recipient, additional scholarships may be awarded. Former scholarship recipients can apply. However, new applicants will be given preference.

Since the Northminster Presbyterian Church gives this scholarship, special recognition of the recipients will be given during NPC's morning Sunday worship when possible.

The rules and the application form for the Northminster Presbyterian Church Scholarship are available on the church's website at www.amesnpc.org. Your MOST current transcript and two reference letters must be attached to the application. The writer of the reference MUST send the letter electronically to amesnpc@gmail.com. The applicant is responsible for ensuring that two reference letters are submitted to the NPC Church Office by the stated deadline, March 31, 2025. The applicant must have contacted the reference person in the last twelve months. It is not required, but if the applicant wishes to have a reference letter from his/her pastor, that letter would be in addition to the two required reference letters.

The Northminster Presbyterian Church Scholarship Committee will consist of members from the congregation. The SERVE Ministry Team oversees the NPC Scholarship.

Funds for the NPC Scholarship will be received from the SERVE Ministry Team's yearly Mission budget. Donations are also welcome from individual NPC members. The NPC Scholarship Committee would welcome memorial money from families who wish to have the NPC Scholarship be one of their designees.

The Scholarship Committee's decisions are final. The award of any scholarship is dependent upon the availability of sufficient funds.
